Adult Fellowship: Anglesea has the last remaining Afternoon Fellowship Group in the Surfcoast Linked Churches. The Afternoon Fellowship is an Affiliated member of the Uniting Church Adult Fellowship. Our local group meet once a month; on the 4th Wednesday at 1.30pm. Our meetings contain the elements of Worship, when we sing and pray and also, of Friendship when we natter, mostly over afternoon tea. We also make sure we have something to "Laugh" about. Our group has always been conscious of its social obligations, whether locally or on a wider scale. Each month an item is identified and notice of this is given to the Congregation. We also participate in a worldwide ecumenical prayer Group, known as The Fellowship of the Least Coin. Annually we send our donation of these "Least Coins" to the World Body, who can then see they are used with care. We have regularly contributed financially to bodies such as Frontier Services and also a North Korean Orphanage. We are all getting older and it is difficult to carry on without the support of younger members of the Church coming in. It only requires your time on one afternoon a month; we would certainly welcome new members either male or female.
