

The big news for us is that John will be visiting Melbourne from May 11, 12 and 13 during which time he will take part in conversations on God, Delight and Diversity, Non-Violent Peacemaking, Celtic and Indigenous spirituality. He will conduct a Quiet Day for ministers and ministry students in the Macedon Ranges, and will deliver a public lecture, Space, Rumour and Hospitality at an inner-city venue still to be confirmed. I wondered how many of us would value attending the public lecture. I have requested information on times, dates, location and pricing and will update as they come to hand.

THEOLOGICAL CONVERSATION ON MARRIAGE

Early this year, the decision of the Assembly of the Uniting Church to allow ministers the right to conduct Same gender marriages was upheld. Our minister, Suzie, indicated there will be time offered for a theological conversation on marriage before individual Church Councils make the decision whether same gendered couples will be welcome to be married in their church buildings.

The Aireys Inlet Church Council reported to the November meeting of Linked Council that they would like to sponsor a forum for the Surf Coast Congregations to open this subject up for discussion. This was supported by Linked Council.

We are mindful that this is a subject on which our members will have widely differing opinions, all based on our understanding of scripture and our Christian beliefs. The idea is to promote an open, respectful and informed discussion that will assist each Church Council to reach a consensus decision that will sit comfortably with their congregation.

The first theological conversation will lead and facilitated by Rev Dr Geoff Thompson on **Saturday the 13th April at 2.00pm at the Anglesea Church.** Geoff is our Associate Professor in systematic theology at the VicTas Synod Pilgrim Theological College. His research has focused on Karl Barth, the functions of doctrine in the church and the theology of the Uniting Church (especially the Basis of Union). Current research is on the relationship between the doctrine of creation and contemporary discussions of sexuality and gender. Please put this date in your calendar and do your best to attend this important event in the life of your Church. Following this conversation, there will be discussion forums offered over a period of time, so everyone has the opportunity to engage and reflect. For example, Rev Sue Townsend (an Aireys Inlet "swallow" and worship leader) is available to lead and facilitate a follow-up workshop further exploring a theological understanding of same gender relationships.

Aireys Inlet Ecumenical Bible Study/Discussion group will start a Lenten Study on Thursday 7th March at 10:30am at the Aireys Inlet church. It looks like a very meaningful study and is entitled, "All I have is yours - Forty days to Freedom by Michael McGirr". You can view a sample chapter at:

Linked Congregations Council Report

New Executive

I am delighted to announce that two members of the Torquay Congregation have stepped up to take on the executive positions on the Linked Congregations Council. At our annual meeting we elected Rosemary Thompson as the Chairperson and Robyn Harper as Secretary. Robin Dennis continues in the role of Treasurer. We should all join in thanking these people for their willingness to give of their time, talents and energy to this important work, so necessary for the effective functioning of our four congregations. Robin, Noni (the outgoing Secretary) and I received a lot of positive affirmation for our contributions over the past three years and really appreciated the prayers of Linked Council members, giving thanks for the past and asking for strength and guidance into the future, for the incoming executive.

Finances

The Linked Council budget is on the positive side of the ledger, partly due to the extended period without a minister. However Linked Council has asked congregations to consider actions that should be taken to ensure that we remain on a sound financial footing into the future.

Church Maintenance

The Anglesea Church Council is facing up to a serious program of repairs and maintenance to their buildings. Linked Council supports the need for our buildings to be kept in good order for the safety and comfort of all users and to ensure their longevity into the future and is working with Anglesea on this. Our thanks go to John Russell and the Property Committee for the time and effort they are taking to tackle this project.

Other items:

Suzie had invited Presbytery Minister, Jeanne Beale, to attend the meeting, to find out more about how Linked Council operates, but Jeanne was unable to be present due to health issues. Jeanne will be supporting Suzie in running two sessions for us on mission in May. The Anglesea congregation has an exciting outreach activity underway, involving sponsorship of practice singlets with the UC logo for the Junior Football and Netball teams along with a weekly encouragement award. John Russell is also providing chaplaincy support to the junior club members. The Torquay congregation is experimenting with a program offered by Synod that provides for online storage of church documents, such as meeting minutes and emails. Office bearers would be given email addresses and access to the data base of documents. This is something that other congregations might wish to adopt and the Torquay congregation is willing to provide training.

The Bellbrae congregation has had the op shop opened over a considerable number of extended hours over the holiday period and this has proved to be very profitable for the church. The op shop now has its own Facebook page, where items of special interest are advertised. The church website is still undergoing renovation. We are very appreciative of the increased promotion and connection to the wider community that we are receiving through Suzie's use of the Surf Coast UC Facebook page. Suzie is working with the Anglican priest for the Surf Coast, the Rev Sharon Valentino, on the need for the provision of ministry to the aged care facilities that are proliferating on the Surf Coast. One option under discussion is the possibility of the employment of an ecumenical aged care chaplain. Linked Council supports the Aireys Inlet initiative to run a forum titled the Biblical and Theological Case for Same Gender Marriage – this will be led by the Rev Dr Geoff Thompson and held at Anglesea church on Saturday the 13th of April at 2.00pm. Our congregations all face the important decision of whether or not to welcome same gender marriages in our churches. It is very important that everyone who is free to do so attend this meeting, no matter what view on the subject you may already hold. The Rev Sue Townsend of the Aireys Inlet congregation will attend and has offered to run follow up discussions. Linked Council has approved Suzie's holidays from June 17 – 30 and September 2 – 8 and study leave from September 30 – October 6.

My thanks

Noni and I wish to thank all of you who have supported us over the past three years in our leadership positions on the Linked Congregations Council. I will not pretend that the job has always been easy, as it has been a period of considerable change for our churches and we have had a number of challenging issues to face. The Uniting Church rule book only takes you so far —we have relied heavily on God's guidance, as we were best able to discern it, to assist us in our decisions, words and actions. There have been many of you who have provided words of praise and encouragement, sometimes accompanied by hugs, at just the right moment. It has been these small gestures, along with your much needed

prayers, that have helped us through the more difficult times. Personally, I want to thank Noni and Robin for their dedication and wonderful professionalism in the way they have carried out their roles. Together, we have worked hard to create a better understanding of the role of the Linked Congregations Council and to bring our four congregations together in greater unity of purpose. I dedicate my support to Rosemary, Robyn and Robin (the 3 Rs) as we work together to see our Christian witness, grow and thrive on the Surf Coast.
