From the Christmas Bowl reflection.

One of the central tenants of the Christian faith is that love is a person, Jesus the Messiah, a baby born in a feeding trough who became the salvation of the world. And yet, our faith is horribly diminished if we merely see the birth of Jesus, the incarnation of God's love, as some sort of historical event, rather than a call to faith.

The Christian faith must resist all sentimentalised attempts to keep Jesus as a baby, confined to his manger, helpless and reliant, and instead draw attention to the life and teachings of Christ – a demonstration of God's love for all the world to see. The love that Jesus teaches is not an emotion or a feeling or even a value or attitude – it is instead a verb.

Love is something we do. It is concrete, not abstract (Luke 10:25-37), it is visible not hidden (Luke 8:16-18), it is confronting not comfortable (Matthew 5:38-48). And so, in response to the teachings of Christ, Act for Peace partners with communities in the developing world through the provision of food and agriculture, peace-making, education and employment programmes, so that people are empowered and equipped to become the gift of God's love for the world.
