Andrew had been into Fiona's bedroom today looking for a book that Fiona had read to him, and he had seen one of her puzzles and played with it, and it had broken, and he didn't know what to do.

Andrew was unhappy.

He thought about going and saying sorry to Fiona.

He thought about offering to pay for a new puzzle.

He thought about telling a story about hearing a noise and going into Fiona's room and finding the puzzle broken.

He thought about hiding the puzzle and telling a story about a burglar.

He thought about saying he was sick and going to bed. What should he do?


