Because Epiphany 6 falls before Ash Wednesday this year, we use the Transfiguration readings. **The alternative is Matthew 5:21-37.** 

The words of Matthew 5:21-37 can be some of the most difficult to accept within the whole Bible. However, this is where the true depth of the gospel becomes clear as Jesus unpacks what it means to be a child of God who is forgiven and engrafted into God's own love. In the Sermon on the Mount, the values of the Kingdom are laid bare, and they are different to the world's values and expectations. While received wisdom recommends an eye for an eye, revenge and payback, Jesus' kingdom values urge us to forgive, and do more than forget, by going beyond the requirements of the law entirely.

#### At the root of Jesus' injunction lies

the belief that if we could go beyond our human desire to get even, or to receive justice, and reach beyond ourselves to others, then we might be able to transform the way they see and act in the world. The objective is to live a life that spreads compassion contagiously so others are also changed/infected to continue the spread. What Jesus isn't suggesting is a meek acceptance of cruelty and domination by others. Rather it is a non-violent response of resistance to those who would seek to

abuse the weak and impose patterns of injustice on relationships or social systems.

It's actually a counter-cultural response that makes a dramatic point to the unjust and oppressor by going the extra mile and beyond oneself, in order to reveal their own weakness. It's a powerful expression of a hope for a better world, in which we think of others and beyond ourselves. What Christ suggests is a very pointed way indeed of showing that there is another way for the world and for us to live by. What change can be wrought in a world where people have the courage to love? What change can happen in us when we see examples of forgiveness beyond what one could rationally expect? I wanted to highlight this week's alternative reading because we have seen this example of radical love and forgiveness through Daniel and Leila Abdallah response to the horrendous deaths of their children Antony, Angelina, Sienna and niece Veronique by Samuel Davidson. What challenge to the structural powers, or simply to bad habits of injustice by individuals, do we bring when someone is brave enough to live by a different set of values and show the way of love?

# SOCIAL JUSTICE GROUP TORQUAY


