Grocery drop off: If you are self isolating and need any items please let me or your pastoral carer know and we will help.

This past week I have had a chest infection that laid me low. I am pleased to say I am now recovering well. It did however, affect my voice causing me to rest it so I could preach last Sunday. I had a list of people I had planned to call for a chat so I will catch this up next week.

It's a peculiar time in the life of the church. I've heard a few people question if the Corona virus is one of the seven plagues mentioned in Revelation. I possibly read or understand Revelation differently to those asking the question and so my thoughts are that it's not. In the book the 7 plagues indicate the completion of God's wrath directed towards those who belong to the kingdom of the Antichrist. COVID19 doesn't discriminate between people or faith. The other understanding I have is that Revelation names God as the source of the plague. But we now know that coronaviruses are transmitted from animals to humans. The prediction, rather than coming from God, has been coming from scientists for many years. In Matthew 24 Jesus speaks to the concerns of end times (or eschatology) and declares no one will know when that is, but the Father. Of

course I look forward like anyone to the new world Jesus promised us, but I don't believe it's today. In the meantime we remember God as revealed in Jesus of Nazareth who humbled himself, healed the outcasts, made friends with the lonely, was made vulnerable and died for us. He gave us his Spirit to gather, to heal us and to nurture us. My friends we are blessed so let's continue to be a blessing.
