??? Who can we blame?

That's a question that's been going through some people's minds as they try to come to terms with COVID-19.

But blaming and judging people doesn't ever make things better. Complaining about what governments are or are not doing won't help the situation.

The Bible says, "He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matt 5:45b NIV), which means everyone is in the same boat; we all have to deal with this situation together.

It doesn't help to start accusing people. In fact the same part of scripture reminds us that we should learn to "love our enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matt 5:44 NIV), this reads as the very opposite of blaming people, but instead means forgiving and helping them.

I find it helpful to remember these words "Jesus understands every weakness of ours, because he was tempted in every way that we are. But he did not sin!" (Hebrews 4:15 CEV)

This is saying that he knows what it's like to live in this rebellious and hurting world, but he didn't turn from God (or even blame God). He would turn to God in prayer, and find help and strength there.

That's what it means to repent; to turn back to God and lean on him - when times are tough and when times are good.
