I was reminded this week of the impact war had on me as a child. Just at the same time I learnt there had been a war in Vietnam we had a few tonnes of wooden pallets delivered to the farm and piled up 3 metres high and 6 metres wide. I had learnt about the deaths of so many soldiers and that many had been subjected to torture. I learnt about the rejection the men and women faced when they returned home.

I wanted to save my brothers from such horror so I designed a hide out in those pallets to stash the boys so nobody could take them away.

Now in Australia we have refugees who have fled their own war ravaged land to seek peace in ours. The world groans under the weighty numbers of those seeking asylum from the brutality of war

The heartbreak of war is the very reason we must remember all our fallen, injured and returned defence force. I have a friend who lost her son, an Australian soldier, 10 years ago to war. War becomes personal when this happens.

In WW2 Deitrich Bonhoeffer blessed a co-conspirator heading to assassinate Adolf Hitler with scripture: "No greater love has a man than to lay down his life for his friends". As hard as it is to accept the violence and mayhem and death that comes of wars, Bonhoeffer's writing illustrates the lengths people will go to fight for what is right and to put an end to what is wrong.

Rev Iris Garden is a Uniting Church minister, writer and lupus sufferer. She writes: "We don't love our neighbours as ourselves. We don't forgive those who sin against us. We don't love and pray for our enemies. We resent, we fear, we hate, and we fight. It's part of who we are.

The answer to humanity's failing is Jesus.

Where we fail to love our neighbours, he loves us no matter who or what we

Where we fail to forgive, he has gone to the cross to forgive our sins. Where we have failed to pray for our enemies, he prays constantly at God's right hand for us, the very people who have hurt him and let him down. Where we resent, fear, hate and fight, Jesus answers with love.

This ANZAC weekend if you are looking for a good book to read, I commend Bonhoeffer's *The Cost of Discipleship* to you.
