We are implementing the guidance from state and federal governments and have cancelled all non-essential events that bring together people from different locations.

It will likely be some months before we return fully to business as usual, but we are working tirelessly to minimise disruption to our services. Our frontline staff and volunteers are doing a wonderful job in finding new ways to deliver the essential services that people rely on such as Emergency Relief, counselling, homelessness and housing services and support for children and families during this difficult time.

Uniting's purpose speaks to the importance of connection. In this period of physical distancing this is more important than ever.

Local Engagement Groups

One of the ways Uniting is building connections with the wider church is through its Local Engagement Groups (LEGs).

LEGs are formed when local Uniting Church congregations get together with local Uniting Leaders to meet regularly, share information and knowledge, and collaborate on local events, issues or causes. Working together, in partnership with the presbytery concerned, they can have a greater impact and presence in their local community.

Barwon LEG showed how successful these collaborations can be when they came together with Uniting Barwon to Flip for Good Cause, right in the centre of Geelong.

Hosting a Pancake Day Stall in the heart of a Westfield Shopping Centre was a great opportunity, not only to raise funds for Uniting's housing and homelessness services, but to showcase the Uniting Church presence across the City of Greater Geelong.

New connections were made between the many volunteers across the congregations. It was a fun-filled day - flipping for a cause together - where plans were made to do the same again next year.
