"Preachers are confronted by some serious questions when it comes to this parable. Many are disturbed by the



harshness of the judgment against the third slave. Is this the type of God we worship—a God who rewards the rich and makes them richer and condemns the poor, only making them poorer?

In order to move beyond initial fears concerning the characterization of the master, it will be important to highlight certain unusual elements in the parable. What is initially striking in this parable is the superabundance of gifts. The table, so to speak, is overflowing.

This parable cannot or should not be used simply as an admonition for good financial practices or as a justification for a capitalist mentality. This would be seriously misusing a profound Gospel invitation into a realm where calculation is abolished. In fact, we discover in this realm the very opposite of a materialist's approach to life:

the interest happens in giving away. Rewritten sacramentally, we could say:

We are invited to a meal where there is simple but good food and most importantly enough for everyone.

Here, we participate in the joy of our master. "


