Spill the Beans worship resource has a monologue of how Joseph might have felt on the day Jesus was born. I thought it was worth sharing with you this week.

"I was tired and weary." I had not slept for the last few days, and we had walked from Jerusalem all the way to Nazareth. My relatives would have nothing to do with us because Mary was pregnant, and we were not married at this point. Even my own brother turned his back on us. The innkeepers all said they were fully booked until one kind person finally offered us the cave he used as a stable at the back of his hotel.

By then, Mary had gone into labour. The Baby was about to arrive at any moment, the women were fussing over her, and handing out orders at what I had to do, but they made it quite clear I was not a part of this.

Its strange really, because I never felt I was a part of this baby. When Mary told me she was pregnant I knew for certain that I was not the father. She swore she had never been with another man, and that it was God who had made her pregnant through the Holy Spirit. I just could not believe her, and I wanted to break the engagement. A few days after that I had a restless nights sleep, and I kept hearing a voice telling me that I should stick by Mary, that she was telling the truth, that this child was special, and I was to have a role in caring for and bringing this child up within our faith tradition. It sounded like the same voice that Mary talked about.

Well, I loved Mary. I really did love her, and after days of wrestling with what she told me I said I would stick with her. And now look at that baby lying there wrapped in swaddling clothes in the manger. Look at that smile, those eyes, those tiny fingers and toes, his wee nose and mouth, and everything about him looks just perfect. I feel like any other dad! Dad, could I really be a dad to this child. This was God's son not mine, yet because he is God's son he is also a child of mine.

None of the family came to visit us when news broke that Jesus was born. But there were shepherds who came in from the cold having witnessed choirs of angels telling them that Jesus the Messiah has been born. There were kings from the east who had followed a special star to be at the birth, and they brought expensive and unusual presents for our special baby. Something very wonderful has happened today. The Light of the world has come, and I believe we all have something to live and hope for now. Whatever lies ahead for Mary, Jesus and me, I trust that God will see us through it, and because of today I just know that he will."

Whatever lies ahead for us, let us trust that God will see us through. Whatever you are looking forward to or not looking forward to on Christmas Day, remember the true reason we celebrate.

God's peace and love is upon you as revealed through the life, death and resurrection of Christ Jesus, our God.
