Dear friends

Mark 1:1-8 Being the messengers of news can be both exciting and daunting because, depending on the circumstances, the news can be, on one extreme, uplifting when it's good but devastating when it's not. News, especially if it comes out of the blue, can pull the rug from under your feet and very often can be life-changing. The impact of news depends if it's something new and exciting or bringing to an end something we would rather have held onto.

Then there's the other side if you are the bearer news. How do you do it? Is it better phoning, or writing, texting or going in person? Do we obfuscate: 'Do you want the good news or the bad news first?'

The Good News, written in Scripture and encountered in Christ, is both welcoming and challenging for us. Mark's Gospel has an urgency to convey the Good News with the declaration of some amazing and life-changing news. This is a declaration of intent that is short, sharp and very much to the point. Mark opens with John the Baptist which heightens the sense of urgency to prepare others to receive the promised light. John gets straight to the point. From nowhere came the message and the messenger; from the desert place came hope. He doesn't dress up for the occasion in any way that might attract others to him or what he had to say, neither does he dress up the message: he tells it as it is.

So while it may be Good News he brings, it's also life-changing and, as such, is disturbing. You see, to receive the light it is necessary to turn towards it. Many were not in the right place but had turned from God and therefore from the light, or perhaps circumstances had drawn them further away isolating them in their own desert places.

There's a temptation during Advent to dress up the message in the glitz and the glamour, the tinsel and the trappings that it gets dumbed down, lost even. As preparers of the light, in attracting the attention of others it's easy to emphasise the good and conveniently neglect the disturbing side of the Gospel. We are sometimes called to go to take the message to challenging places: the dark, uninviting wilderness places of the world but we can shy away from that challenge.

So might be we remember that Jesus came to bring the full Gospel and it is that full Gospel that his own are called to share and live out.
