Dear friends

I write this on Thursday afternoon watching the riots take place in Washington. While it is political, it is also theological as many supporters of President Trump claim that the Democrats are evil. Evil enough to prompt the return of Jesus. Yesterday, January 6th, was the *Feast of Epiphany* and I am reminded that an insecure ruler named Herod was so threatened by the birth of Jesus that he tried to overthrow the result by putting a hit out on a toddler. Theology and scripture are needed together to think through what we are seeing and hearing from the USA. What follows are snippets of a post by Christy Lubbers Berghoef regarding the election and Christians. The full account is on my Facebook page.

"Christian traditions throughout history have embraced a variety of end times theologies. One such position asserts that Jesus will return when the state of humanity becomes consumed by evil and destruction beyond repair.

I am seeing a disturbing trend among some of my white evangelical Republican friends (religious leaders included) stating that Democrats winning elections is so evil that Jesus will surely return - VERY soon.

Just to be clear, the enslavement, torture and dehumanization of black and brown bodies on our soil for centuries was not bad enough to usher in this return of Jesus? The removal and slaughter of indigenous populations was not enough to usher in Jesus' return? Plagues that decimated populations was not enough to bring him back? Hitler's ovens were not bad enough to usher in the return of Jesus? Various genocides, mass poverty, bloody civil wars and countless other atrocities across the globe throughout history were not bad enough to bring about the return of Jesus?

None of these unspeakable realities hit the bar of awfulness that is required to compel Jesus to return. But Democrats winning elections in the United States is the thing that finally hit the mark.

It reveals precisely how tiny their Jesus is and how created in their own image, how hollowed out the richness and depth of Jesus' life and teachings have become. Perhaps it ultimately signals that they have surrendered a significant part of Jesus to the authority of Trumpism rather than surrendering themselves to the authority of the Jesus of the Gospels. The Feast of Epiphany tells us that the paranoid Herod king sent death squads to Bethlehem with instructions to kill all male babies under the age of two. To me, this is the worst story in the bible - the Slaughter of Innocents - all so that one man could keep power.

It's tough when we see and hear Christians divided because of political and theological ideologies. It's tougher when Jesus is used to back up claims of a particular side or a weapon to justify destruction, hatred and harm.

Today, I am remembering the Christ who, because of a powerful and yet fearful ruler, became a refugee and fled to Egypt. **This is the God we follow**.

May this 2021 contain immeasurable peace, hope, love and joy to you and yours
