The Bellbrae musicians have wonderful stories about the instruments they play. The instrument Bill is holding is a sackbut. The sackbut came into being in the 15th century as a slide trumpet, but is the forerunner of the modern trombone. It is thicker metal and a narrower bell than a trombone (and a different mouthpiece) and has a lighter airer sound. Bill's sackbut is a reproduction of a 1551 instrument made by Meini (Germany). Bill bought it about a year ago as he has a keen interest in early music (Baroque and pre-Baroque).

John has a cornet. I don't know the history of John's brass instrument but it struck me as a great example of some people I know. The bell end is fairly damaged. The metal is crumpled and dented. People can be or feel like that. The thing is, the mouthpiece works fine and brings forth beautiful music that swims through the lead pipe exiting through the bell and out into the worship space. We really are like that ourselves.

With broken bodies, broken minds, broken hearts, and sometimes broken lives, we gather to bring forth a rhythm that the community of faith can sway to, can sing with, can be stretched because of the fact we are of faithful heart here to make joyful noise. What comes out of each of us can bring music and light to so many others. Sure it gets piped out of a dented and crumpled bell, but a bell is there to be rung and beckon. No matter your broken body, broken mind. broken heart, if not broken life, stay in the rhythm of worship and breathe music and joy into the faith community.
