Thoughts for the Third Week of Lent.

#### Inequality.

Inequality can mean many things to many different people. Inequality can depend very much on where a person was born, and when, it can depend on physical characteristics, whether they are tall or short, fat or thin, on their DNA, what they eat, whether they are physically disabled in any of many different ways, on, on their mental abilities, and on their financial circumstances.

Inequality often refers to the unequal distribution within society of income, wealth and goods. Everyone should be able to put food on the table and have a safe, secure place to live. Australia is one of the wealthiest countries in the world, and we pride ourselves on being 'the land of the fair go', but many people would be surprised to find how large the gap is between the few who have a great deal and the manywho are struggling to get by with very little. In Australia today, someone in the highest 20% of the income scale lives in a household with almost six times as much income as someone in the lowest 20% of the income scale. This will have a very major effect on where you live, what you eat, your quality of education, who you associate with, what activities you become involved in, your health, your mobility and what sort of work you do. In many ways this will perpetuate inequality, asthose with the best opportunities, will generally get the best jobs, and the highest incomes.

As Christians we do what we can to help those who need it, physically,

by visiting, talking to and helping those in need, or financially, by giving food to the hungry, clothes to the poor, or giving help to one or more of the many welfare organisations in this country.


