Thoughts for the Fifth Week of Lent.

Climate Change

We hear so much about Climate Change, but how much, as individuals do we really know and understand? Scientists tell us that the earth's average surface temperature has risen by 1.1 degrees Centigrade, over recent years. That may not sound very significant to us, but the earth's ecosystem is so finely balanced, that "any" increase results in increased heat, drought and insect activity, which in turn results in declining supplies of fresh water, increased likelihood of wildfires, and then reduced agricultural yields. At the same time, an equivalent increase in ocean temperatures has resulted in greatly increased ice melting at the polar icecaps, small increases in ocean depth, and coastal flooding, particularly on Pacific islands and Bangladesh.

The major cause of global warming in recent years, has been man-made, caused by the burning of fossil fuels (coal, oil and gas) throughout the world, and the destruction of native forests, and global warming becomes a worldwide problem which does not recognise national borders! The burning of fossil fuels generates excessively high levels of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere, which create a thermal barrier, thereby increasing earth temperatures. We know that trees absorb large quantities of carbon dioxide, and will reduce atmospheric effects, but is it enough? How can we, as individuals, slow down the global warming phenomena? We can reduce our consumption of electricity, gas and oil in our homes, by turning down our domestic heating, avoiding excessive use of coal, oil and wood heaters, buying the best energy efficient appliances, installing better home insulation (no draughts and reduced heat loss) installing solar panels for electricity generation, buying more fuel-efficient cars, using more public transport, turning off unnecessary lighting, using LED light globes, and washing clothes in cold water. All small changes on their own, but if we all work together, we can do it!

And save our wonderful earth in good condition for generations to come...
