This week has been National Reconciliation Week.

This started as the Week of Prayer for Reconciliation in 1993 (the Int. Year of the World's Indigenous Peoples) and was supported by all of Australia's major faith communities. In 1996, the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation launched the first NRW. In 2000, Reconciliation Australia was established to continue to provide national leadership on reconciliation. In the same year, approximately 300,000 people walked across Sydney Harbour Bridge as part of NRW, to show their support for reconciliation.

"When we have power over our destiny, our children will flourish. They will walk in two worlds and their culture will be a gift to their country" *Uluru Statement from the Heart.*

Message from the Minister's Desk

We face a tough reading this Sunday with **Mark 3:20-35**. There is mental instability accusations, claims of demonic possession, crumbling kingdoms and divided households and a declaration of who is family to Jesus.

I think today's gospel reading is saying that our human family, for all its virtues, is limited. I imagine all of us have, at some stage, tried navigating through the pain caused by family. No doubt some have dealt with division, disagreement, or perhaps exclusion.

Which is incredibly sad, because everyone I have ever met, simply wants to fit in, to belong to something bigger than themselves

So how great is it that this is what Jesus has done in today's gospel reading. He is forming a new family composed of those who had difficulty fitting in with their human families. He is accepting the outcast, the lonely and the shunned. He is breaking down barriers between strangers and telling them they are now related to each other through their relationship to him. Being part of his family is so easy; all you need to do is follow Jesus.

I hope you have done well through this week's lockdown. Any separation from family and friends is difficult, even distressing.

I hope that the God who loves you, brings comfort to your mind and joy within your heart in those times of isolation.


