A CALL to PRAYER by Maxine Flakemore

My personal experience of an answer to prayer.

I would like to share with you a brief history of my spiritual journey.

As a child, due to my family circumstances I was an intermittent church attender. As a teenager I made a choice to attend church regularly. I was inspired by the difference in behaviour towards patients that I noticed in the nurses who were Christian. It wasn't until 1990 that I experienced a real awakening that led me into a personal relationship with Jesus.

In 1996 I experienced an incident that changed my whole awareness of the power of prayer and my relationship with God. My thoughts on prayer and belief once were, 'Well that's all good for some but I don't think you need to believe to that extent."

As my contribution to the annual church fundraising fete, held in Torquay I was providing massages. About three days prior to the fete, I started to feel quite unsettled and was unable to sleep. Whilst driving into Torquay on the morning of the fete I experienced an overwhelming feeling of dread. It was so powerful that I started to pray out loud as I drove along. All I could think of was to ask God for protection for my whole family.

About two hours later there was a knock on the door of where I was massaging. I was surprised to see a Christian lady from our area standing there. I didn't know her well and hadn't seen her for a couple of years. I remember her words quite clearly. "I don't want you to be worried. Your son has had an accident but he's all right. When you see the car, you'll realise that he was protected."

At the age of 19, he was driving too fast in an older model car on a gravel road. His car had overturned and he was left hanging upside down, covered in glass with the car absolutely wrecked, around him. He was totally unharmed. As he said, he felt like he was in a cocoon. What blew me away was, that where the accident happened was the section of road where I was praying out loud as I drove into Torquay. He had overturned on the only clear section of that road, between two power poles on one side and a row of trees on the other!

This is what has influenced my absolute belief in the power of prayer.

I would like to encourage us this week to continue praying, as of last week and to praise and give thanks for God's protection of us all hereabouts where we enjoy peace and freedom. For future direction in our ministry to each other and to others. For forgiveness for where we have not acted in the way that He would wish for us. For His provision for our needs at this time and for those we wish to help.
