A CALL TO PRAYER- Week 9 Inspirational Prayers -1 Corinthians 6:19-20

As a nurse I have cared for many people. I call myself a Christian and am writing about prayer, with the awareness that I have never really experienced true hardship. By accident of birth, I live in a blessed, prosperous country. When I nurse people who have experienced a life changing disability, I am inspired by how they can still continue on, have faith and be happy in life.

Joni Eareckson Tada comes to mind. Joni calls herself a God reflector. She became a quadriplegic at 17 and has since become an inspirational Christian writer. She prays, using scripture. "I pray using God's word, as I know it is reflecting God's language and is pleasing to Him."

On describing her week, she said." I have a different look every day. On Monday I have the Barbara look. Barbara likes to use lots of makeup and a big hairdo. **Tuesday**, Beverly dresses me, she can be grumpy and doesn't like makeup and sometimes forgets to comb my hair. Julie comes on **Wednesday** and parts my hair on the other side. Thursday, Bella is often rushed and forgets to wash my face and on Friday I look just right as Jane talways akes time to listen to what I like....".

Joni says that ascribing value to our life is about reminding ourselves of the price Jesus paid. I often used her thoughts to teach about empathetic caring, whilst teaching nurses.

One inspiring person stands out. He lived at Grace McKellar Centre, where I once worked.

His name was Wally Shultz. He was the happiest person I have ever encountered. Wally came from Grovedale and started life as a farmer. He suffered Multiple Sclerosis for 50+ years and to top that, became blind in the years preceding his death. Wally was completely dependent on others for all his needs. He had every excuse to complain but never did. All Wally could do was talk and he did so cheerfully non- stop whilst being fed, which could be very annoying. Dosed several times daily with many tablets he would say, "Put all 12 in at once. It's easier that way, then stick my straw in, down the hatch!" Wally's straw was made from a long piece of flexible plastic tubing, the type used in fish tanks. Every Sunday, Wally attended the Lutheran church in North Geelong, transported on the tray of a utility happily sitting upright in his electric wheelchair, long before the days of maxi taxis! He faithfully brought back with him, tapes of the weekly sermon from his church.

Wally had such a presence, that whilst feeding him, nurses tended to tell him their troubles. He would say. "Now I would like you to open my locker, second drawer and you will find a tape there. I want you to take it and have a listen. Just return it when you are finished." I also poured out my troubles once to Wally and received a tape, which I politely

.....placed in my bag and promptly forgot about.

Three months later whilst experiencing a very difficult time I found Wally's tape, still in my bag. I felt guilty for not having listened to it or returning it sooner. I quickly decided to skim through it so that I could honestly say that I had listened to it before returning it. I felt like God had sent me a personal message!

Excitedly returning it I said how it had been so what I needed to hear at that time. Wally burst into tears. His wife explained to me that he had been giving tapes to nurses for many years and mine was the first to be returned, with the first feedback he had ever received! She said that *Wally saw his main task for God in life,* as trying to help the nurses who cared for him. He told me that he asked God every day to take him. I was able to say to him that perhaps God still needed him to minister here. He obviously had no awareness of how he was such an inspiration to others.

Prayer points for this week:

- To think of all those who are so afflicted.
- To ask God for His continuing presence and comfort in their lives.
- To give thanks for people like Joni and Wally, who though disabled still care for others.
