FROM THE MINISTER"S DESK:

Dear Prime Minister

As a Church we have watched with great distress the takeover of Kabul, Afghanistan by the Taliban. Over the years many of us have had the enormous privilege of being invited into the stories told by refugees in Australia. We have been blessed by the experiences they bring to our lives as well as how we have been able to enter into their lives.

Being a refugee isn't about politics from where we sit in pews surrounded by kind and compassionate followers of Christ Jesus. Being a refugee is about fleeing danger and death Being a refugee is about people. People who until this past week could go to school, go to work, sleep peacefully because they were safe to do so. People who were not exhausted and in agony from planning and panic. People who could sit at dinner tables with family and friends sharing a meal and their lives.

People who have an identity, a name, a culture and hope for their children's future.

But here we are witnessing a frightening, unsafe and unknown life for many. Jeremiah 9:17-18 says:

"Thus says the LORD of hosts: Consider, and call for the mourning women to come; send for the skilled women to come; let them quickly raise a dirge over us, so that our eyes may run down with tears, and our eyelids flow with water."

God expresses grief which carries on from Jeremiah 9:10 to where it is said that God "will weep and wail" for the devastation of the land and for the unfaithfulness of the people of Judah. God says that he does not want to weep alone and calls for the mourning women to weep with him.

As we gather in pews and faithfully study God's Word, we are to share in and care about what is happening to these citizens in another country because their panic and desperation isn't about politics for us. It's about people.

Dear Prime Minister, because we are distressed by the suffering of these people, we ask you to issue priorty refugee visas for Afghans and their families who have worked alongside our Australian troops for years. We ask that you would open ways for them to seek refuge here in this land so they may find safety and we can be privileged to hear the stories told by displaced and oppressed people. So that we can be engaged and involved in the experience of sharing their lives and have them share ours.

As a Church, we will continue to pray for policy makers and enforcers. We will pray for strength and wisdom for you Prime Minister - particularly for the massive workload that sits before you. We will pray for those people fleeing their home and those who remain.
