From the Ministers Desk...

How beautiful is this weather? Reminds me of Brisbane winters.

This week we find ourselves in the last two weeks of our stewardship program. Encouraging words have drawn us closer together which is of itself, is a good outcome. Many thanks to the congregation leaders who have wisely guided and generously shared their own time, talents and treasure as an example of working together in a joyful way. You are a blessing.

There's a program called *Spirited Generosity* aimed at helping our individual thinking and doing when it comes to following Jesus. It helps us to reflect on where we are when it comes to giving joyfully to God and others. I thought it could be helpful to share this with you especially the ideas about TIME and sharing. This resource has been written by Carolyn and Fuzz Kitto, and here are two of their guiding statements to stretch our thinking...

- 1.Our Time and the choices we make...
- · "I am involved in charity work which takes my time and some of my money."
- "We volunteer and teach our children the value of volunteering."
- "I chose a profession where I can mainly work from home to save the travel time for other activities and contribute more to my local community..."
- 2. Our Possessions and the choices we make...
- · "Money and values involves a constant checking process for me. I came from Presbyterian stock. I am careful with money but I love giving things away."
- · "I donate things I don't need to charity rather than selling things on ebay. This way my excess goes to someone who needs it."
- · "We chose to share our home with other people, both in having people to meals we cook and also in having people live or stay with us."
- "We have gone to a one car family and are walking more. We are finding that we can cooperate on car use."
- · "We research all our big purchases for our needs. Once we identify that we really need something, we search for the best price."
- · I buy locally rather than on-line, I choose to support our community businesses.
- I buy at sales and try not to impulse buy.

These are simple ways of thinking through how we are tracking what we are doing, what we want to do, and what we hope to do, in order to serve the Church and those in our wider community. But it's more than that, it is about how we are supported and encouraged in our community and how we support and encourage others in return. It serves us well to regularly review how we spend our time, talents and treasure.

We have choices – do we binge on Netflix or help out at Food Aid or make an encouraging and supportive call to someone.

We are journeying through TREASURE over the next two weeks and will be joined by Jonathon Cornford (video) and Rev Linley Liersch (video and live). Many of us have appreciated the thinking of both these theologians and I am feeling blessed they are generously sharing their time and talents with us.

NB: If you are a volunteer either involved in Worship and/or activities at our Surfcoast Uniting Churches, we need to register your vaccination status. As of Friday October 15th, it is mandatory that an employer gathers and records the vaccination status information on any person working anywhere other than from their own residence.

This applies to all staff, paid and unpaid volunteers. This is a requirement throughout the entire state of Victoria.

The register will be held by each Congregation or Council Chair. This information will be treated confidentially and known only to us.

The document indicates that as of Oct 15th, all workers/volunteers must have one vaccination and by November 26th be fully vaccinated.

At the Zoom meeting this week with Presbytery we discussed many issues around Covid. One issue was to clarify what a volunteer is.

Until we hear otherwise we are regarding anyone who does work for the church in a voluntary capacity is a volunteer.
