ARE WE CALLED TO Generosity or Justice? 1 Chronicles 29: 14

There is a human tendency to believe that all the good things we enjoy are deserved. Either we have worked hard to earn it, or we have been virtuous and been blessed by God – that somehow what we have is to do with us. The shadow side of this is to assume that misfortune and disadvantage are also deserved – that laziness, bad decisions or simple lack of ability cause poverty. **God begs to differ.**

Today the remaining front of the newsletter will have a brief summary of the talk Rev Linley Liersch gave to us who attended the AGM of the Surf Coast Link Congregational Council, which this year was open for anyone from our three congregations to attend.

Linley spoke about the change in Christianity's place in the world over the last 50 years.

Where once all services ,including schools, social support, community dances and other events were all centred around the churches of that community...this has changed. Churches are now on the edge.

We went on to brainstorm some of the **MYTHS** that we believe or have believed about ourselves as members of the church:

- We are the centre of society.
- People of faith are superior.
- All Christians are good people.
- One ministry per congregation is expected.
- There's a church on every corner.
- We need buildings to worship in.
- The idea that the minister is the Shepherd and the rest of us are the flock, rather than all of us helping the whole flock.
- That we should attend church every week.
- That worship should be on Sunday.
- That worship should have the same format week after week.
- That getting more younger families and youth will solves our problems.
- That other people understand what church is about.
- That a bigger church is a better church.. People wise. Big is beautiful.
- That we are all on the same page theologically.

These thoughts shared will help us in the process of changing the way we think and do church.

The Mission Mapping strategy coming from the Presbytery is meant to raise some of the hard questions we find difficult to answer as congregations and presbytery. The story is of regeneration—of new and renewing growth and how best we can do this together.


