
THE CAMINO TRAIL...

After several attempts (thwarted by weather, tides, competing demands and COVID) the Aireys Inlet Uniting Church organised the inaugural Ecumenical Surf Coast Camino for January 22, 2023. Twenty-seven pilgrims gathered on an afternoon when the weather was perfect. We met at the Split Point Lighthouse at Aireys Inlet. Rev Bob Thomas led us in a discussion of why we had come and sent us out with a prayer for our safety and reaching our goals for the Camino. The two musicians, Keith on a ukulele and Christa on flute led us in a few songs. Then we headed out along the Cliff Walk of Aireys Inlet. This part of the walk takes in beautiful vistas out to sea and some treed sections. At the end of the Cliff Walk we descended to Sunnymead beach and stopped for a wonderful series of Psalms written for the area and presented by the Surf Coast Anglican Priest Rev Sharon Valentino. Our musicians presented some more inspirational songs before the walk continued along the beach and over rocky headlands. Our next stop was on a rock platform with high cliffs on one side and views down the coast to Anglesea on the other. Rev Dr. Lindsay Carey (RAAF Chaplain) presented the next devotional focusing on Ezekiel's vision from God that a personal in-depth commitment to God was expected and showing how that applies to us too. More songs and we continued on the last leg of the journey to Urquhart Bluff, two headlands further on. At our final destination, Rev. David Thompson (retired UC minister) delivered a final devotional and prayer. The musicians unpacked their instruments again and, while sitting on a small hill with the sea as a backdrop, presented us with more uplifting music. We then embraced the Camino tradition of making a small cairn with the stones that we had brought from the start of the journey. A delicious dinner and time for fellowship followed.
