VALE JAN HALE

It is with great sadness that we learned of the passing of Jan Hale last Tuesday.

Jan had been a member of the Torquay congregation since she and her husband Bob moved to Torquay from Highton in the early 2000s.

Jan was born in South Australia, the daughter of a Baptist minister. She completed her education at the University of Adelaide. She became a partner to Bob, a mother of four and a gifted teacher of language and literature.

After some time in Papua-New Guinea, she and Bob settled in Highton and soon became involved in the life of St. Luke's Uniting Church. Jan's great passion was for social justice and the arts. She brought this passion to Torquay. She was instrumental in arranging a significant art exhibition in the former church hall. She was also a strong force in the development of the Surf Coast Uniting Church Social Justice Committee, which took leading action in the establishment of a local branch of Rural Australians for Refugees.

Jan took a hand in the arranging of many public meetings concerning refugee issues. Her home was always available for activities and discussion, and always offered with great hospitality.

Following the disaster of the sinking of the SIEVX refugee vessel, Jan encouraged the Surf Coast Social Justice Committee to participate in a national project to create a SIEVX memorial in Canberra where groups were invited to paint poles one for each of the persons who were drowned. Accordingly, a pole was prepared by the Surf Coast Group and taken to Canberra where it

Jan was an enthusiast, full of ideas but also having the drive to implement them. She commenced the Beaut Beanies knitting group at the church, and then succeeded for a while to engage the wider community in a Beanie Festival.

She also loved music and dedicated herself to learning to play the harp.

In recent times Jan "slowed down" and faced some health issues. So we say farewell to a remarkable lady. May we share some of her passion for social justice.

We extend our deepest sympathy to Bob and the family.



From the Sermons this week: Matthew 14: 13-21. Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

¹³ When Jesus heard what had happened, he withdrew by boat privately to a solitary place. Hearing of this, the crowds followed him on foot from the towns. ¹⁴ When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on

them and healed their sick.

15 As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the

villages and buy themselves some food."

16 Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." "We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish,"

they answered.

18 "Bring them here to me," he said. 19 And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the peo-ple. ²⁰ They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. ²¹ The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.
