

Did you know? Some facts about our Bellbrae Opshop & Book Room

Our Bellbrae Opshop & Book Room is considered part of the 'circular economy'. A circular economy seeks to design out waste and pollution, keeping products and materials in use for as long as possible. The work of charities and Op-shops like ours assists thousands of people in aged care services, education programs, emergency/crisis relief, home visits, hospital and health services, hostel accommodation, mental health services, suicide prevention counselling, medical research, prison visits and migrant/refugee assistance.

We send material to Uniting Care for use in such programs, and recycle older and unsaleable clothes to become rags. In diverting clothing from landfill, we also:

- reduced carbon emissions across the supply chain
- reduced global water consumption
- · reduced global energy use
- generated more value to the Australian economy

So next time you stop in to browse or buy at our Opshop or another, or if you donate goods, or volunteer your time, you are helping in a small way to make a big difference.
